BRADING,

A SMALL market town In the Isle of Wight, distant from Newport, eight miles, and from Ryde, four. It has nothing remarkable except the church, which is very ancient, and said to have been the first religious establishment in the island. It has some ancient monuments of the Oglanders: the tower stands singularly on four open arches, which form a porch to the west door. The accommodations for travellers are here pretty good. This town formerly sent members to parliament, but was excused from that burden, as it was once considered, on account of the inability of its inhabitants to pay their representatives. Brading Haven when filled by the tide, exhibits a fine sheet of water: but when the tide recedes, it becomes merely a tract of naked mud, some hundred acres in extent. Various attempts have been made to recover this vast marsh from the usurpation of the sea. The last and most remarkable was, in the time of James the first, Sir Bevis Thelwall, a page of the King's bed chamber, and the famous Sir Hugh Middleton, were the principal persons concerned in the project: but after expending £7,000 in carrying it into execution, they found the nature of the soil did not answer their wishes, and at length an overwhelming spring tide making a breach in the embankment, the sea once more resumed its former situation. It appeared, however, from a well which they discovered near the middle of the haven, that it had not always been in this unprofitable state. Market day, is Saturday. Fairs are held May 12th, and October 2d. The amount of the population in 1821, was 2,023.

COWES,— (ISLE OF WIGHT)

DENOMINATED East and West, and situated on each side of the mouth of the river Medina, is about 16 miles from Southampton, and 5 miles from Newport. West Cowes is a town of considerable note and the principal port of the island. It stands on the declivity of a hill, in a situation healthy and airy, and convenient for sea bathing at any time of the tide, commodious machines being placed on a fine beach at the west side of the castle; warm bath are also provided. Its extensive sea prospects, inland views, embellished by the river, and the numerous villas which

decorate it render the neighbourhood of Cowes highly attractable. A promenade of considerable extent has lately been made along the shore. The harbour is much frequented by shipping on account of its safety and convenience, particularly in time of war, by merchant vessels waiting for convoy. Ships of war have been built here, and the place possesses every requisite of docks, &c, for building or repairing. There is a castle of considerable antiquity, though not very remarkable for construction, built in time reign of Henry the 8th, in 1539. East Cowes is the smaller town, seated on the opposite shore, which Leland tells us, in his time had a castle: on this side is the custom-house for the island. There are numerous handsome residences in the vicinity of Cowes, which enjoy situations of peculiar beauty. It has a market every day, and an annual fair on the Thursday and Friday in Whitsun week. West Cowes possesses a population of 3,379

NEWPORT

Is a pleasant and populous town, seated on the side of the river Medina which forms a navigable communication between it and Cowes, for vessels of small burden. The government of the town is vested in a mayor, aldermen, &c. and the corporation send two members to parliament. About a mile and a half from Newport, on the summit of a hill, stands Carisbrook Castle, remarkable in history for having been the Prison of Charles the 1st, the window is still shewn from which he attempted to escape. Nothing certain can be said as to the original building of this venerable monument of antiquity, but it is highly probable, that both the ancient Britons and the Normans might have availed themselves of this advantageous situation; nevertheless, it is certain, no part of the present building can claim so high an

antiquity. It was re-built in the reign of Henry the 1st, and again repaired in that of Queen Elizabeth. The house of industry, is one of the best regulated and commodious in the county, and is the only one in the island. The poor are employed in the manufacturing of sacking, dowlas, stockings, &c. the profits of which have caused a considerable diminution of the poors rates; it is capable of holding 700 persons. The grand military depot or barracks, is situated about a mile from this town, they are worthy of attention from their great extent, beautiful situation, and extreme cleanliness. The church is a very ancient building, situated in the centre of the town, the tower of which contains a peal of eight musical bells. There are also several places of public worship for various denominations of dissenters. The town hall is an elegant structure, built from a design presented to the corporation by the celebrated architect, Mr. Nash. The free school, which is a plain stone building, with convenient apartments for the master, was built by public subscription in the reign of James the 1st. The school room, which is fifty feet long, is remarkable for being the place in which the commissioners from the parliament, held a conference with King Charles the 1st. There are also several charity and Sunday schools in the town. Newport has lately been lighted with gas. Its clean and well paved streets, handsome assemblage of shops, and good inns, render it a place of fashionable resort in the summer season, where numerous parties of nobility and gentry enjoy the beautiful scenery of this fairy island, by quitting the bathing places for the recreation of a ride to this town. The market is held on Saturday, for corn, cattle, &c. and there is a fair on Whit Monday, for pedary, &c. The population is 4,059 inhabitants.

Once an insignificant village, but now a populous town of considerable celebrity as a fashionable watering place, is divided into upper and lower. The former stands on an eminence commanding a most delightful prospect, and is joined to the latter by a street consisting of handsome houses. An elegant little Theatre has been erected, at a considerable expence, which is well frequented during the season. The public library and reading rooms are of the first description, and well supported. But one of the most important improvements of Ryde is the Pier, erected pursuant to an act of Paliament: the object of this Pier is to remedy the inconveniences of embarking and disembarking, which were previously very considerable. It extends from the quay down to low water mark, and is built on piles driven into the earth to a considerable depth; the surface is partly covered with gravel, and a railing extends on each side the whole length of the pier. Several hundred feet were washed away by the high winds and tides in 1809, but it has since been completed on a more extended and secure plan. Ryde is surrounded by elegant seats, the residences of the first nobility in the kingdom, among which are those of the Marquis of Buckingham, Earl Spencer, the Hon.C.A. Pelham, &c. &c. This place may boast of every requisite for a summer residence, and bids fair to become the most fashionable watering place in the kingdom, as it already is the most convenient and beautifully picturesque. The town of Ryde and Newchurch parish, contain a population of 3945.

YARMOUTH – (ISLE OF WIGHT.)

Is a neat little market town, standing on a bank sloping to the sea, on a healthy situation, with pleasant views of the channel. The principal inn was erected by governor Sir Robt. Holmes, in 1671, for the accommodation of Charles I. on a visit to the island. This is a borough town, and has regularly sent members to parliament from the 27th. of Elizabeth. It obtained a charter of franchise from Baldiom de Redver, in the 13th. century, and was re-incorporated by James I. in the seventh year of his reign. The present members are Sir Peter Pole, Bart. and Henry Broadhead, Esq. The castle was erected by Henry VIII. in whose reign the original church was burned by the French. The present church stands in the middle of the town: in a small chapel adjoining it, is a fine monument of admiral Sir R. Holmes. Yarmouth is much diminished from its ancient consequence. Its many narrow streets destitute of buildings, laid out methodically In right angles, clearly point out its former enlarged site. The neighbourhood of Yarmouth, like the rest of the towns In the Isle of Wight, abounds with elegant seats and beautiful scenery, as well as the most enlivening views both by sea and land. The population amounts to 564 persons. Market day, Friday, and a fair on the 25th. July, for pedlary, &c.
