

Marriage of Sydney Caws, Minnie Davis

A PRETTY WEDDING—was solemnized at St. Helens Parish-church on Tuesday last, the contracting parties being Mr. Sydney Caws (a much respected young Trinity pilot), son of the late Mr. S. Caws and of Mrs. Caws, of Warren House, and Miss Minnie Davis, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Davis, of Kimberley. The Vicar (Rev. F. Wilkinson) officiated. There was a large congregation at the church to witness the ceremony, both the bride and bridegroom being very popular. The bride, who was given away by her father, looked extremely pretty in her wedding gown of white silk. She also wore a wreath of orange blossoms and veil and carried a magnificent bouquet. The bridesmaids were Miss Blanche Greenham and Miss Mabel Caws (sister of the bridegroom), who were attired in light cream, with hats to match, and wore gold 1903 brooches set with turquoise, the gift of the bridegroom. Mr. Wallace Caws (brother of the bridegroom) acted as best man. A reception was held at the home of the bride in the afternoon, when there were a large number of guests present, the gentlemen wearing white heather nosegays, specially obtained from Scotland for the auspicious event. Both bride and bridegroom were the recipients of a very large number of presents, many of them being very handsome and costly. Mr. and Mrs. Sydney Caws left at 3 o'clock for London, where the honeymoon is being spent, the congratulations and goodwill of everybody going with them.
