THE REV. LUTHER BURDEN.

The death occurred on Wednesday of the Rev. Luther Caws Burden, of The Wedge, High Street, Scaview, wno since his retirement from a London ministry two years ago, had been the esteemed minister of the Sculch

who, since his retirement from a London ministry two years ago, had been the esteemed minister of the Seulch (Methodist) Church there.

Mr. Burden, son of the late Mr. William Clarke Burden, of Ryde, was born at Seaview, where he spent his early years. As a youth he was a prominent player for Seaview F.C. Later he went to London, where in 1914 he joined the Congregational ministry, and from then on he held posts at Parkstone, Fakenham, Isleworth, and Brentford. His church at Brentford was extensively damaged during the war, and shortly afterwards his leg had to be amputated. In the first world war he was an honorary chaplain to the Forces, and also worked on the land. His retirement in 1946 terminated 20 years' chaplaincy of the West Middlesex Hospital, and he came back to his birthplace to live. There he was persuaded to give his services to the Betjah Church, and since then had regularly conducted services. He was an eloquent and forceful preacher. He took a keen interest in local affairs, and his naturally cheerful outlook gained him many friends. He was a Freemason, and is survived by a widow, to whom he had been married 42 years, and two so is and a daughter, with whom sympathy is expressed. A service at the Beulah Church was held yesterday (Friday), and cremation takes place at Southampton to-day (Saturday).
